Today's Advisory engaged students in a fun activity that allowed each member to consider how well they actually know their peers and teacher. It was titled Snowball Fight where each student wrote a fun fact about themselves on a piece of paper, crinkled it up into a "snowball" and then others had to guess who it belonged to. - A. Superintendent Report: Superintendent Christine Godino formed a committee to review the NESDEC report and make recommendations. The committee consists of staff members, parents and school committee members. The meetings will be held Wednesdays at 3:!5-4:15PM virtually for 4 weeks. During Winter Break, the Avon School District was able to pick up KN95 masks from the Department of Education and were provided with enough masks to supply the employees for six weeks. A sincere thank you was extended to Kathy McDonald and Scott Hulien for picking up the masks. The mask mandate was extended until February 28th. On New Years Day, Superintendent Godino picked up rapid tests for all staff allowing them to test before returning from break. The number of kits received were reduced from the original amount, so the kits needed to be split. Superintendent Godino sends her appreciation to Jennifer Meek and Sarah Shaw for assisting with that task, along with distributing to staff prior to their return. The new COVID testing program was recommended by the Department of Public Health and DESE, and the program would eliminate contact tracing and test and stay shifting the focus to symptomatic individuals. Each staff member and student would receive an at home test to test each week through 4/22. Participants would need to opt in to the program, and reports would be reported to the schools, and the positive case numbers would continue being reported to DESE.
