Research shows that missing 10 percent of school, or about 18 days in a school year, negatively affects a student's academic and social performance. That's just two days a month and is identified as chronic absence from school.

Research also shows that being PRESENT IN SCHOOL improves academic performance, social emotional skills, and leads to higher civic engagement during and after middle and high school. We want students here and want them to find success.
