- A. Principals report:
 - Butler Elementary: Dr. Reynolds
 - Welcome to four new staff members.
 - Goal this year is to be accountable to everyone and 100% transparent.
 - Goal inclusive practices in classroom; response to intervention has caused a shift in mindset to more differentiated instruction.
 - Technology Every Monday a consultant from Code to the Future is in the building to provide staff support and professional development. Students are currently working on coding. Starting in November or December they will move to lego robotics, and will finish the year with minecraft.
 - Dr. Reynolds explained this lobby bulletin board entitled: "Barometer of Influences". This board shows the research regarding effectiveness of the various strategies used in education. Homework has been found to have little to any effect on student achievement. Thus new homework practice at Butler is to eliminate formal homework and have all students ready 20 minutes every evening.
 - Two staff have been trained as trainers in "Differentiated Instruction" and have begun presenting mini-workshops at each monthly staff meeting.
 - As a result of the school's health and wellness committee the Great Body Shop curriculum has been revised and teachers have received new training.
